Your request for information was received on March 16th 2015 and was dealt with under the terms of the Freedom of Information Act 2000. Please be advised that the Business Services Organisation (BSO) has now completed its search for the information you requested with regards to correspondence sent from or received by BSO in 2005 and 2006 in relation to the coding of glucosamine.

I refer to your previous request for information (our reference FOI 101-2014 refers) and your additional request and can advise you that the only information held for this period is presentation slides from Pharmacy Roadshows. I have attached these at Appendix (1).
